For the past several weeks, in our Sunday morning sermons, we have been taking a quick refresher through our Mission, Values, Marks and Strategy as a church. These are the four sides of our "Vision Frame," a frame that reveals the bigger picture of how to be the church the Lord has called us to be. Currently, we are looking at the side of the frame representing our Values; and even more specifically, this past Sunday, we looked at the value our church places on Christ centered relationships. Relationships that are built, not only with other church members, but those in the community around us, where the Lord has placed us. Relationships where we express and show to others the same love, mercy, and grace that Jesus has poured out to us. Relationships where we are living out and sharing the HOPE we know; that can only be found in Jesus Christ.

And as we go out into the world, building relationships within our relational circles, I offer today this quick reminder ... **Never be afraid to share your story!** According to an article from National Geographic, our ability to listen and comprehend the complexities of life through stories, is hardwired into our biology. Meaning, that information shared through a spoken story is absorbed much quicker and easier than many other means of presentation. Upon hearing a story, our brains are built with an ability to quickly connect dots and bring together facts, that are then immediately thought through on a deeper level. Here is the good news... we all have a story to tell. Even more, God has made our brains ready to hear stories in order to help make sense of this crazy, often confusing world around us.

Jonathan Gottschall writes, "We are, as a species, addicted to story. Even when the body goes to sleep, the mind stays up all night, telling itself stories." Aleks Krotoski observes, "Stories are memory aids, instruction manuals, and moral compasses." And author, Terry Pratchett states, "People think that stories are shaped by people. In fact, it's the other way around." The reality is, stories inform, stories instruct, and especially, stories inspire. And we all have a story to tell about the HOPE we know in Jesus Christ.

In Psalm 107:2, scripture urges the reader to tell of what the Lord has done in their life. "Has the Lord redeemed you? Then speak out! Tell others he has redeemed you from your enemies." If you are a believer, this is your story... that Jesus has saved you from the greatest enemy facing mankind...sin! And as the psalmist is recognizing here, one of the greatest gifts believers can offer to others... is their story.

I challenge you, in every relationship you have, do they know your story? Do your kids know your story? Do your extended family members know your story? Do your co-workers know your story? Do your neighbors know your story?

Everything points to this simple fact that your story of HOPE through Jesus is ready to be heard, and has the potential to engage others toward deep spiritual thought. Again, I share all this today as a reminder that your story has the potential to change lives! **Never be afraid to share your story!**


Goal: everyone in our church is being prayed for by someone everyday:




