As a church, over the past several Sundays, we have been reviewing our Vision Page, which expresses the Mission, Values, Marks, and Strategy of our church. This has been a great opportunity to re-look and work through this information, as we have many new members and visitors to our church family who were not with us yet when we originally went through this on a larger scale.

Specifically, a few weeks ago, one of the value statements we looked at was how Kent First Baptists values real authentic relationships. Whether it be our spouse, friendships, neighbors, or co-workers, we understand that the Lord intentionally places people into our lives for a reason, and we value the time we have with each person. Through this, we were challenged to take a closer look at each of our relationships, and ask some hard questions:

- Are their hidden motives or deceit in our relationships?
- In each relationship, is our number one desire to see the other person grow in their faith?
- Are we truly delighted to share our lives with other people... because we know that the HOPE we have in Jesus is the most important thing we have to share?

It is encouraging that many of us have taken significant time to think through each of our relationships, and discover how to make Jesus our central focus. But, as some have thought through this, it brought about a question I wanted to quickly address. The question was asked, "Am I still supposed to give 50% if the other person is not giving their 50%?"

Here is my best answer to this... real Christ centered relationships are not a 50/50 proposition. The only way a relationship can endure the ups and downs of daily life is not for each individual to contribute only 50%, but for each individual to contribute 100%. Now I realize there is much more to this that I don't have time to explain in this short writing, and please know that I am very much an advocate for healthy boundaries and limitations in every relationship. But as scripture says in Philippians 2:5, "You must have the same attitude that Christ Jesus had.", which means... in every way try to be like Christ.

As we look deeper, and compare what Christ said to the culture around us, you will find Christ and culture often stand contrary to one another. The world teaches that it is all about you, and what makes you happy, and how you need to always put yourself first. But when we actually follow and apply what Jesus teaches, it changes our perspective. Jesus says in John 15:13, "There is no greater love than to lay down one's life for one's friends." I have to be honest, if I am only expected to contribute 50%, there is no way I am about to lay down my life for anyone. But, if I'm to contribute 100%, then laying my life down and putting the needs of someone else before mine becomes the natural reaction.






Goal: everyone in our church is being prayed for by someone everyday:


